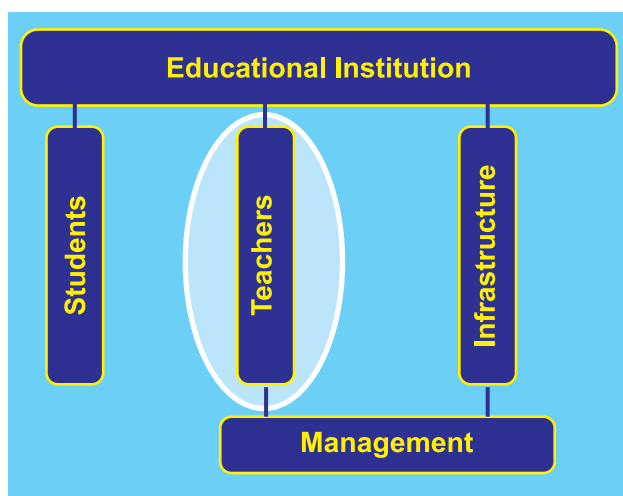

OGA Managing Committee Initiatives

Panel Setup for Rationalization of Salaries for our OGA College Teachers.

Due to various historical and other reasons, there is no uniformity in the salary structure in our colleges. Each college has adopted its own policy which was not necessarily based on logic. With the result for the same lecturer post with same qualifications and experience their pay differs enormously. If we do not pay good salaries to our teaching staff we cannot attract good teachers and cannot expect good education.

The problem got further accentuated due to stopping of recruiting of teachers by the Government. We are now left with majority of unaided teaching staff with meagre salaries.

The MC of OGA in its very first meeting decided to evolve a uniform pay structure to our college teachers. A sub committee consisting of OGA members along with all the Principals of the OGA colleges has been formed. We have collected the present pay details of all the teachers working in our colleges and are trying to fix a minimum

salary. Mrs.B.Padmaja and Dr.NVN Charyulu along with the President and Secretary of OGA are presently working on this very difficult issue.

Once we evolve a minimum salary pattern, we would request the Exhibition Society to sanction the difference of pay to our colleges. We are very happy to inform you that for the first time in the history of Exhibition Society they have made provisions for recurring expenses like salaries in their budget proposals.

Attempt to improve quality of Education in our OGA colleges.

In our Country, the Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER), which is a statistical measure of Percentage of students enrolled out of total eligible students, is at a respectable 26 %. However, unfortunately, when it comes to quality of education there is a lot of scope for improvement. As per the latest 2018 figures, not a single Indian University figures in the top 250 in the World.



With this in view OGA has already started encouraging our colleges to modernize teaching methods by way of digital classrooms. An Academic Committee has been formed with Prof. Laxman Rao to come out with recommendations to encourage students and staff to work together in this

area. Already two programs have been conducted. Due to space constraints we are not able to provide details here. You are most welcome contact of Prof.Laxman Rao to discuss and give your suggestions and comments if any to him or to Secretary OGA. His email id is naglaxman@yahoo.com.

Imparting soft skills and starting of employment oriented courses

Soft Skills: We all realize how important soft skills are in getting a suitable job. We are encouraging our colleges to introduce soft and employable skills during the evening hours free of cost, especially to the final year students so that their chances of getting a job are improved.

Job Oriented Courses: There is a need to start job oriented courses in our colleges so that the students going out of colleges are able to get suitable jobs. We will discuss with experts in this filed and come out with possible and affordable courses.

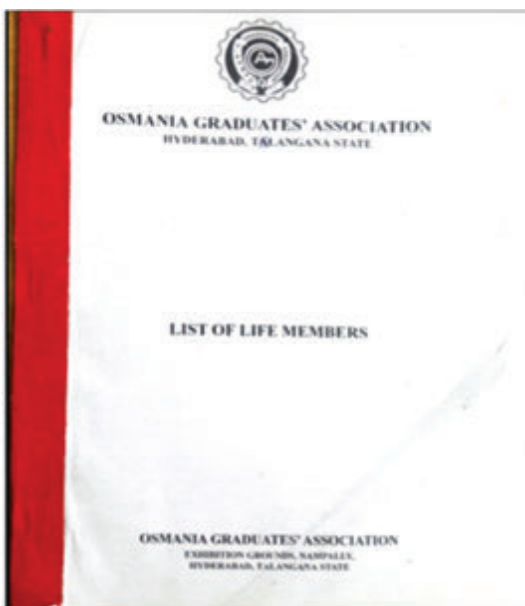


Revamping the OGA website:

Updating OGA members list



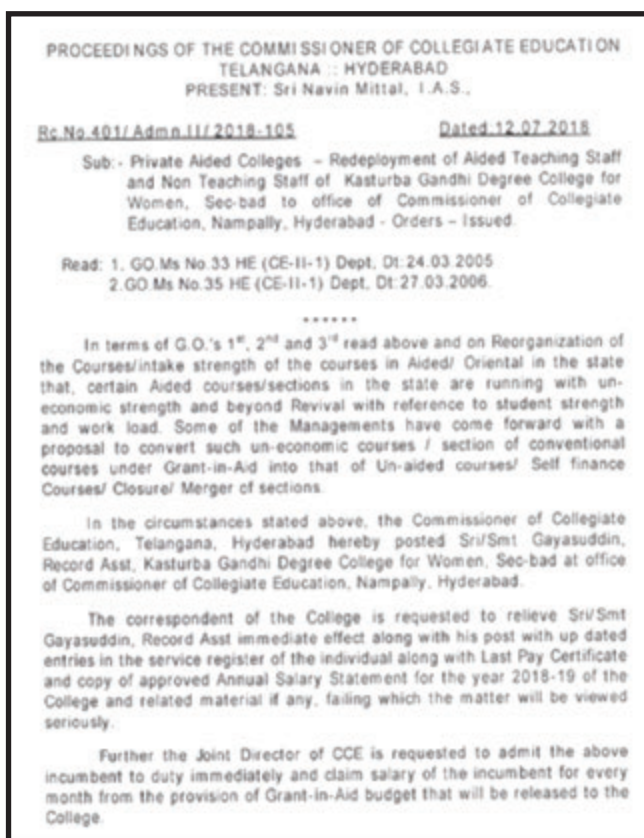
Updating OGA members list

Recently, the Collegiate of Higher Education has transferred several of our aided staff to other Govt. institution, which indicates that in future there will be either a Govt. College or a Private College. Already, the MC of OGA is seized of the matter and in fact had detailed discussions in the MC meeting.

One advantage of complete privatization would be we will have autonomy of the colleges. We will further consult with experts and come out with strategies how best to use the situation arising out of the action of the Govt.

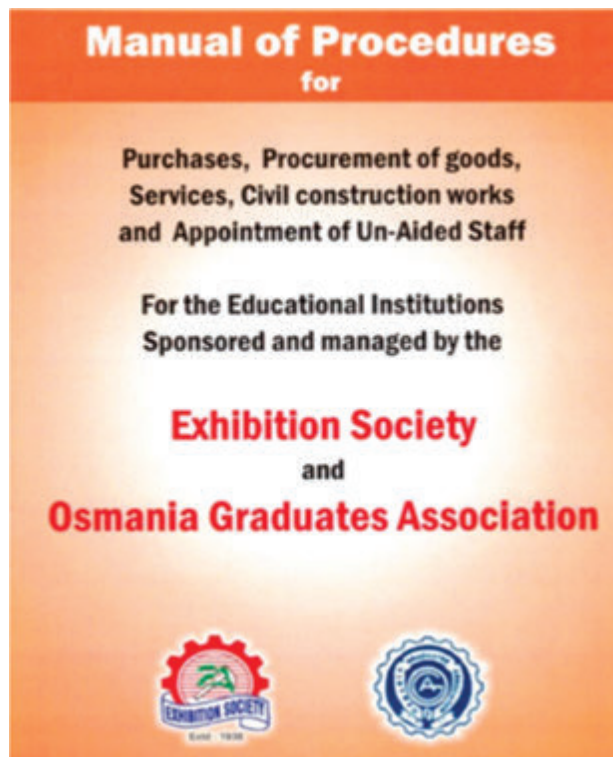
Revising Manual Of Procedures For Purchases And Constructions

A Manual of procedures was prepared in the year 2011 to lay down some rules for the purchases and Construction works taken up by our Institutions.

A standard manual of procedures in respect of purchases, procurement of material, engaging services, civil construction works and appointment of unaided colleges staff for all the educational institutions sponsored by OGA and Exhibition Society has been developed by a committee headed by Mr Padma Rao with Dr.Gangadhar Rao as convenor and other senior OGA members.

The manual was approved by Managing Committees and the General bodies of both OGA and Exhibition Society. 7 years have passed and it is time to update the document based on the experiences we had. In view of the happenings in some of our institutions since the introduction of Manual of procedures left much to be desired.

The MC of OGA decided to update the manual and recommended that it should be made mandatory for the institutions and to view seriously to initiate appropriate disciplinary action against those who do not follow or violate the procedures and flout the norms. However, certain clauses of the manual need to be modified in view of the changing situations and new sections need to be added.



An attempt is being made in this direction with the help of a committee formed by the MC. In this connection, OGA seeks the cooperation and support from all the OGA and Exhibition society members to forward their valuable suggestions to Secretary, OGA by email. Our approach would be "PREVENTIVE STEP IS BETTER THAN A DISCIPLINARY ACTION".



Recommendations of the Brain Storming Workshop. On "Challenges Facing our Institutions: Possible Solutions"

Documenting Problems faced by our colleges:

The workshop discussed various Financial, student related and Academic issues related to increasing the Academic Standards of our OGA Institutions. The broad area were:

Financial

- Payment of decent Salaries to our unaided staff which more than 90% presently
- Non-reimbursement of fees (running into Lakhs/crores) by the Government departments
- Declining strength of qualified aided teaching staff
- Rigid uneconomical fee structure
- Disparity in fee reimbursement to aided versus private institutions

Student Related

- Poor attendance of students in rural colleges
- Restructuring of syllabus to suit the needs of the society
- Implementation of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) to be introduced by UGC

Academic Related

- Challenges in Improving overall academic Standards:
- Lack of Receptive/Interested students:

- Need for quality Teachers:
- Lack of Interesting Syllabus:
- Improving Infrastructure facilities (Labs, e-class rooms, computer facilities etc.)

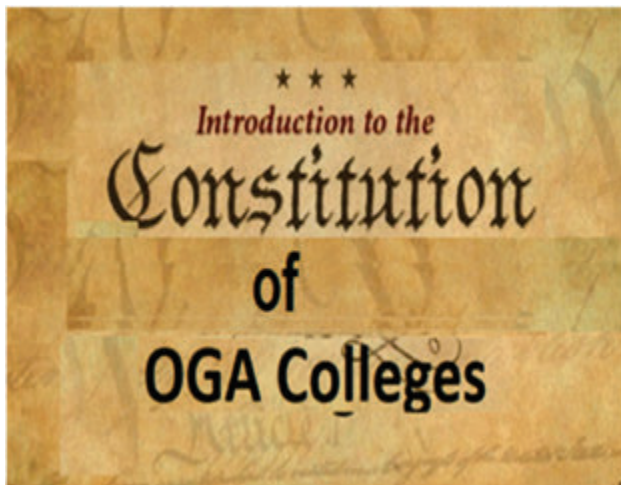
The Managing committee of OGA is planning to bring out detailed proceedings in the form of a booklet which covered the above subjects. The Brain storming sessions were attended by experts from UGC, eminent teachers, educationists and management members of colleges in the city. The recommendations of this work shop were sent to the concerned *Government departments, sponsoring Bodies and Colleges/Institutions sponsored by the OGA.*

Thus the publication would try to put most of the issues and possible solutions at one place for further discussions in the light of latest developments connected to our colleges.

Framing A Common Constitution For All The OGA Colleges:

For any organization to function there should be a constitution wherein powers and functions of its Governing body and its members are well defined. Same is true for a college also with additional details about managing its staff members. It has been observed that only 5 Colleges have constitutions framed 40 to 50 back.

A common Constitution brings uniformity of functioning of Governing Bodies of all our institutions. This is of paramount importance. Keeping this in view MC of OGA has embarked on developing a common Constitution for all the colleges. A committee has been constituted and the committee is working on this initiative.



The “NEW COMMON CONSTITUTION“ would clearly lay out the procedures; duties and responsibilities; accountability of Office Bearers as well as Governing Body members. We learn that such an attempt was made during the tenure of Sri. S.Padma Rao garu as President of OGA. We would try to complete this job. Once the draft is prepared we will be presenting to the General Body of OGA for approval.

OGA associates with Hackathon Hyderabad :

Osmania Graduates' Association along with Economic Committee and the Exhibition society hosted the event. Many other software companies like Microsoft, Google etc provided the logistic help.

This year in the first round around 10,000 students participated from all the districts of Telanagana and around 1000 students were selected to participate in the final round which was held in our Gandhi Centenary Hall. The program lasted for 36 hours non stop.

SP College Report on Community CPR Training in Gandhi Hospital

Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) is a series of life-saving actions that improve the chances of survival, following a cardiac arrest. Successful resuscitation, following cardiac arrest, requires an integrated set of coordinated actions represented by the links in the Chain of Survival.



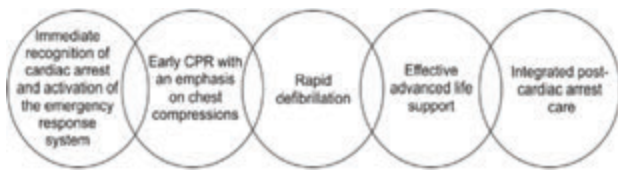
Community CPR Training was conducted at Gandhi Hospital by Alumni Association of Gandhi on 14th September 2018. 60 Students from our Sardar Patel College attended this CPR training programme and gained very valuable knowledge of saving a life in emergencies. They were given training on the following:

1. Immediate recognition of cardiac arrest and activation of the emergency response system.
2. Early CPR with an emphasis on chest compressions.
3. Rapid defibrillation.
4. Effective advanced life support,
5. Integrated post-cardiac arrest care.

The newest development in the CPR guideline is a change in the basic life support sequence of steps from "A-B-C" (Airway, Breathing, Chest compressions) to "C-A-B" (Chest compressions, Airway, Breathing) for adults

CPR" is emphasized for the untrained lay rescuer. On the basis of the strength of the available evidence, there was unanimous support for continuous emphasis on high-quality CPR with compressions of adequate rate and depth, which allows for complete chest recoil, minimizing interruptions in chest compressions and avoiding excessive ventilation.
